Moscow: care for multimorbidity

- > In Moscow 30% of seniors 60+ have three or more chronic diseases
- Therefore, program of individual assistance to older people with multiple chronic diseases was developed by the specialists of the Moscow Department of Health
- Program start: April 2017
- Specialist in diseases of elderly in every Moscow municipal clinic
- Increased time for reception of elderly patients:
 - up to 40 min. for primary reception instead of standard time 20 min per patient
 - ▶ up to 20 min for secondary reception instead of standard 12 min
- Phone consultations
- Regular monitoring of health

Advantages of innovative technologies in social care

Public elder care service institution

New decision

- The rules are defined by the public service institution
- Segregation from society
- Social workers & teachers are staff at the service institution
- Centralized organization of the daily routine, including control

- The rules are set together, taking in account seniors' preferences
- Aim: full integration into society
- Social workers & teachers as "guests". No attendants: to get something, seniors need to learn how to do it
- Individual rights and independent decisions made by elderly
